

ERA 2010 OUTCOMES—NATIONAL OVERVIEW

Approximately 65 per cent of the units of evaluation assessed in ERA were rated at world standard or above (i.e. received 3s, 4s or 5s) for ERA 2010.

Of the 2,435 units of evaluation that were assessed from 40 institutions (697 at the broad two-digit level, 1,738 at the four-digit discipline level), the following ratings were received:

- 308 units of evaluation rated at 5 or 'well above world standard' (69 at the broad two-digit level, 239 the four-digit discipline level)
- 508 units of evaluation rated at 4 or 'above world standard' (115 at the broad two-digit level, 393 the four-digit discipline level)
- 776 units of evaluation rated at 3 or 'at world standard' (229 at the broad two-digit level, 547 at the four-digit discipline level)

Australia performed 'well above world standard' (i.e. received 5s across four or more institutions at the four-digit discipline level) across the following disciplines:
